

Building Better: Bird-Friendly Guidelines

Due to birds' inability to perceive clear and reflective glass as solid surfaces, Toronto Green Standards has developed a guideline, including a number of strategies to improve bird friendliness of glass structures and protect local and migratory bird populations.

Use of bird friendly features-visual markers applied to glass help birds' object focus and ultimately, their perception of surrounding buildings, making them more avoidable. Visual markers include films, decals, or patterns spaced at a minimum of 28cm and which are applied up to approximately 12m above ground level, approximating the height of trees. Site conditions and surrounding environment should inform usage of the guideline/best practice.

At Zigg, we've used patterned glass at windows and balcony railings up to and including the third floor.

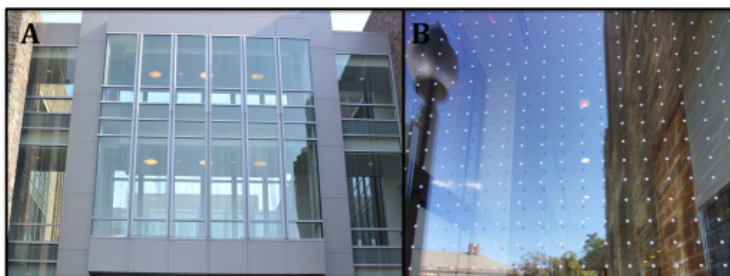

Sequence of Work Suite Interior Finishes

Once layout and framing are completed, suites are drywalled and doors, trim and baseboard applied. After suites are painted, tile and cabinetry are installed, which task is well underway on site. Finally, countertops, flooring fixtures and hardware are complete.
